You have attained the respect and admiration of your peers by distinguishing yourself in service and leadership to your unit and you have been rewarded with this remarkable opportunity. If you so choose to take the path that has been laid before you, a world of new opportunities for brotherhood, leadership, and service will open before you, as they have for so many that have come before.

In 1915, two men, Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carol A. Edson, started what would become an international program within the Boy Scouts. From the Treasure Island scout camp, in Pennsylvania, they established the principles of Brotherhood, Cheerfulness, and Service then applied them to a group of young men who were found willing to spend themselves in serving others. When camp ended, these young men were bound together and in so doing, became the first members of the Order of the Arrow. Since that time, the program has spread coast to coast and across two oceans.

As with any journey, it begins with a single step, the first step. That first step is the ordeal. It is for you to decide whether or not you will go forth upon this journey, but it is my sincerest wish that I might call you a brother after your choice has been made.

Ordeal Information

If you choose to take the path laid before you, then you must first surpass the ordeal.

Where: Boxwell Scout Reservation

When: June 3-June 5, 2011

How much: Early Fee - \$48.00 (by May 27th) or regular Fee - \$58.00 (after May 27th)

What to bring: (Keep in mind that **all** items must fit in a backpack)

There are several key elements that you must bring to better fulfill the Ordeal.

- **A water bottle**
- Ground cloth,
- Sleeping bag
- A backpack to carry **all** your personal equipment
- Complete class A uniform (no merit badge sash),
- Toiletry items such as soap, towel, etc.
- A pair of working gloves
- A pocket knife
- A poncho (Rain gear)
- Clothes you don't mind getting dirty
- A little cash for use in the trading post when your ordeal is over
- **A full stomach for Friday night.**

What **NOT** to bring: Extra food, drinks, radios, televisions, sheath knives, hunting knives, CD players, computer games, or *bad attitudes*. Garbage bags and totes for carrying your supplies are not permitted.

Registration Information

Registration begins by mailing in the attached registrations form to the Council Office. On Site Registration starts at 5:00 p.m. and goes until 7:00 p.m. on Friday night, but we are asking that you try to show up at the arrival times listed below which are divided by county. Those who show up after 7:30 p.m. will not be able to go through the ordeal because you will have missed key aspects of the weekend and it would be unfair to you if you were to miss them.
